Let It Be Us is a 501(c)3 Child Welfare Agency licensed through the State of Illinois. It's programs and initiatives significantly change outcomes for the children served by increasing the number of Illinois licensed foster homes available to foster care agency caseworkers. Let It Be Us recruits and educates foster parents, and provides direct referral of them to agencies via our Licensing Coaches. Let It Be Us operates through grants and donations and started out of a desire to recruit more families for children in foster care. Today, Let It Be Us uses best practices in digital marketing and recruiting to reach more people to attract them to the world of foster care.

Foster Parent Recruitment & Information Fairs

1,400 People attended fairs.



Targeted Recruitment Program

Let It Be Us created a registry of licensed foster homes - a considerable resource for agencies struggling to find licensed homes. Caseworkers call Let It Be Us for children who are in emergent need or are difficult to place. Let It Be Us uses the registry and social media to reach out to licensed homes who meet the child's needs for placement. Let It Be Us are experts in digital marketing and recruiting.

- 700 Licensed foster parents in registry.

Coaching Program:

The process to become a licensed foster parent is logistically challenging and emotional. To support and encourage parents to obtain their foster care license, Let It Be Us started a Coaching Program in June 2019 where Coaches with extensive experience in foster care licensing work one-on-one with parents to answer questions and provide guidance.

100 Families coached and licensed with many more in process.

Initiatives to Assist Children in Foster Care:

Our Closet

Serves children in the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) Waukegan office.

300 Sets of children (individuals & sibling sets) received diapers, wipes, bottles, formula. winter

coats and school supplies.



IHSA 5th Year of Grant

IHSA is the the Illinois High School Association that has given Let It Be Us a 5 year grant from 2014-2019 of 60 Illinois high schools filling backpacks with school supplies to deliver to children in foster care.

900 Backpacks filled and delivered.

Direct Support

Impactful support for children in Illinois foster care - with the goal of making a profound difference - funding Chromebooks, tutoring, an educational trip through school, or helping an older teen aging out of foster care get his or her on her feet.
